CCSC Minutes, May 4, 2013

Call to order - Frank Paynter

Reading of the Minutes – Steve Statkus: Minutes approved as previously distributed.

Reports and Statements of Officers and Committees;

Secretary – Steve Statkus: No report. New Members: No new members reported. Member Resignations: No resignations reported.

Treasurer - Rolf Hegele

Cash Balances: \$20 K savings & \$12 K checking. Income and Expenses: Income down YTD \sim \$4K due to lower than planned flight activity. Expenses are \sim \$5K over budget due to tow plane annuals and engine replacements. Gas Cost: Gas will continue to be \$0.46 per 100 feet for the month of May due to tow plane break-in requirement to use 100 oct. low lead from Cubby's.

Operations/Ground Tow Vehicle Maintenance-Director of Operations-Mark Miller: The club flew about 15 flights at the ridge. The G102 landed out successfully. Flight ops are on the rise with 22 flights this past Wed. (5/1) with a single tow plane.

Glider Maintenance - John Dudley: 2-33 15H annual complete. 16Q and 135 annuals due in May.

Tow Plane Maintenance – Tim Christman/Paul McClaskey: 33Z available for tow. 48L still in break-In and needs tow pilots to fly off the

remainder of the break-in period. 909 red tagged as the annual has expired. Paul working on a ferry permit.

Facilities/Grounds Equipment Maintenance – Mike Hutchison: No report.

Public Relations – John Dudley: Remote video cameras are installed and working. It was decided to support the Huffman Field Wright Bros. celebration in Oct. with multiple gliders displayed and a CCSC display.

Social Activities – Mark Miller/Jim Dudley: No report.

Unfinished Business:

Wright Memorial – Steve Statkus: Effort is on track for 5/25 & 26. Need volunteers. Come out either or both days.

- **2014 1-26 Nationals**: Wick Wilkenson the 1-26 VP for the Eastern Region came to see out facility and brief the board on the selection process, goals of the organization and planning. It was decided to wait until the 2013 CCSC regional are completed to submit costs and schedules. It will be run concurrently with the 2014 Region 6 contest in June.
- Region 6 contest preparation Rolf Hegele: 26 contestants have applied for sports and FAI classes. Camping and trailer rental charges need to be defined. Help is needed to assemble registration packages. Ground crew help is needed.

New Business:

- **Blanik Sale**: The CCSC board had no objection to the SSD moving to sell the Blanik. John Lubon will lead the effort.
- 90 day no fly rule: After a relatively brief discussion it was decided that the reasoning behind the initial UOP was sound; 'to protect CCSC equipment." The UOP will be slightly changed to emphasize that fact but allow members to maintain currency in their own

gliders but if they exceed the 90 day period without flying a CCSC glider they must receive a field checkout with an instructor in a CCSC aircraft. Mark Miller agreed to rewrite the UOP and present his version at the next board meeting. If approved the revised UOP will be published on the website, soar-ccsc.com, for the 30 day approval cycle before becoming offical.

- **CCSC legal waiver** adjustments: After much effort the following documents have been adjusted and approved by aviation lawyers to reduce the club's liability in the event of an accident: Membership Application, Application for Limited Membership, Membership and Transient Aircraft Waiver. All club members must sign the updated Membership Application and it will be kept on file at CCSC. This is a one time requirement. All guests (non-members) must sign a Membership and Transient Aircraft Waiver before flying a club glider. This must be done anytime a guest flight takes place. It is expected that the crew chiefs will take on this responsibility. This effort will be briefed at the upcoming crew chief's meeting.
- **CCSC Website**: Frank and others have been working to update the website. It's interactive and running presently. Go to soarccsc.com and check it out. It will be the vehicle for communication going forward.
- CCSC/SSD Organizational Issues: A work in progress as reported by John Lubon.
- Club Phone List: Bill Maxwell stood and made a passionate plea for the use of a larger font when printing the phone list and including the spouses name in the directory. Since the phone list is being updated for the new web page a larger font will be used when printing paper copies. No decision was made concerning the spouse request.
- **Safety**: Steve Statkus reported on the status of the on going effort to encourage pilots to monitor personal wellness before stepping into the cockpit. This effort will continue in the form of Frequent Flier articles.

The board voted to adjourn at 12:45.

Wright Memorial Event 2013:

CCSC is bringing back the Wright Memorial contest this May 25-27. As in the past it will be a low-key contest open to any currently insured SSA glider pilot with his or her private glider and CCSC members flying club gliders. We'll have two tasks to chose from and contest flying will be over Saturday and Sunday until 3:00 pm. Gliders will be handicapped. We're inviting local pilots to compete. The flight contest will be as follows:

Fly what you got. Two courses with three turn points, each worth 100 points. You have one hour to complete the course. Timing starts at the beginning of the tow and ends at touch down. If your L/D is greater than 23/1 the course is: Lebanon Airport, Dayton Wright Bros Airport and CCSC. Verify each turn point using your cell phone camera (or plotter if you have one and know how to use it) as you cross the middle of the turn point. 1 point deducted for each 10 seconds over the hour time limit. 1 point added for each minute airborne and on the course. If you're flying a 2-33 or 1-26, the turn points are the middle of Stolies Strip, the middle of the spill way dam, and across the middle of Cubby's strip. Same deal with the camera and flight points. You can repeat turn points but only after you have completed the course one time.

Make as many attempts as you want over Sat and Sunday until 3:00 pm Sunday 5/26. Each attempt must be timed and logged. Your best time counts. Check out the course on the topo map in the clubhouse.

In addition to the contest (we hope club members will compete) we could run a spot landing contest as last year and a bomb drop competition if volunteers step up. Members who own unique wheels are encouraged to bring them out for display.

We'll have a hog roast. Draft beer will be available for \$1.00 per glass. Music and a bonfire in the evening can be expected.

To make this weekend enjoyable for all members and families we need volunteers. Don't think you have to cover the whole weekend but if you can commit to a day that

would go a long way to make this weekend happen.
