CAMPGROUND ELECTRIC TESTING DONE

The amperage drawn by each trailer was measured individually on 12/31/2013 and none appeared to be excessive. The total current for all 22 units was about 26 amps, with the highest being 5.9 amps. This is not considered excessive since they had all been disconnected for 3 weeks and battery chargers were probably operating. During the three weeks they were disconnected the meter reading did not change, so it was demonstrated that no power is being lost.

A year ago a similar measurement of the power drawn by individual trailers was made with no prior warning. At that time there were multiple campers pulling from 12 to 15 amps which is enough to power a 1500 watt heater. This is also enough to explain the high winter power bills.

Owners are now permitted to reconnect your electric service. You are asked to be prudent in your use of electric heaters. As a club we are trying to avoid unnecessary waste; we are also trying to avoid the expense and burden of individual meters for each trailer while being fair to each member. Monthly random checks of the current drawn by individual campers will continue.

For the year the campground power bills totaled \$4655, whereas the power consumed by all the rest of the glider port came to only \$4939. So, there appears to be an opportunity for savings.

CHAMPIONSHIP CONTESTS IN JUNE

CCSC will host the 126 Championships and also the Region 6 South Championships June 11 to June 22, 2014. Already 23 have signed up for the 126 contest and 5 for the Region 6 South. It is anticipated that a total of 50 gliders will compete, so special arrangements are being made to accommodate all the trailers and activity. For instance, the tow plane hangar will be used for all pilot meetings and meals because our clubhouse is not large enough.

Youthful legs and lungs are best suited for ground crew work, which includes assisting pilots in moving their gliders to the flight line, launching gliders in rapid succession, retrieving any gliders that need a re-launch, retrieving gliders at the end of the day when all return at about the same time, etc. If you are interested in helping or can recruit a teenager who will help, contact Todd Dockum: todd@thetechpark.com, 513-461-3535.
