Frank Paynter and Pete Schradin will host a "Condor Day" at CCSC on Saturday February 8 (snow date February 15), from 10am to 6pm. The morning will be devoted to helping beginning Condor flyers with their Condor setups. Once everyone is ready we will be off to the races. The afternoon will feature a fun and easy 'online' multiplayer cross-country race.

We will have several Condor setups available if you don't have your own, but you are encouraged to bring your own Condor setup (PC or laptop, joystick and rudder pedals, etc). Pete and Frank will work with you to optimize your settings and get you going with XC flying in Condor.

The afternoon session will utilize a local network provided by Frank, but you will need to have an internet-capable PC (wired or wireless - doesn't matter) to join the afternoon race.

Rolf Hegele provided a financial summary of 2013 and pointed out that we ended the year with all bills paid and enough cash in the bank to cover winter time expenses. The budget for 2014 is much more cautious with several cost reductions and several revenue increases already implemented, giving a solid basis for optimism about the financial picture in 2014.

Both Frank Paynter and John Lubon presented President's reports that focused on improvements recently implemented and the great plans in place for 2014.

Awards were presented. Dan Reagan was recognized for achieving Gold Badge status with 3 Diamonds. Dan and John Lubon were recognized for their record flight to Blairstown, NJ. Tom Geygan got the award for most flights (63); Mark Schababerle was the most active tow pilot with 184 tows; Rich Carraway again was the most active instructor with 99 instructional flights; Paul Schuette was the most active Youth Member (41 flights). The 2nd Sunday Crew won the prize for most launches (278).

To help you comply with the FAA Flight Review required by FAR 61.56 arrangements are being made for ground schools at which the required ground instruction can be completed. Take advantage of the ground school and avoid waiting for an instructor when the flying is good.

CHAMPIONSHIP CONTESTS IN JUNE

CCSC will host the 126 Championships and also the Region 6 South Championships June 11 to June 22, 2014. Already 23 have signed up for the 126 contest and 5 for the Region 6 South. It is anticipated that a total of 50 gliders will compete, so special arrangements are being made to accommodate all the trailers and activity. For instance, the tow plane hangar will be used for all pilot meetings and meals because our clubhouse is not large enough.
